Podstawowe zasady opieki nad pacjentami kluczy na owenatze jest miedzy:

- Hypotheses being tested - independent variables are manipulated to obtain dependent variable values
- Multiple dependent variables possible - factorially manipulated or complex partially confounded, like factorial designs
- Hypotheses being addressed in preplanned experiments
- Potential danger: any random change observed likely to be due to random error not to
- Hypothesis: the prediction or statement about experimental or natural world phenomenon
- Experiments require preplanning and well-rehearsed procedures, effects to be tested or compared have theoretical potential
- Field experiments - experimental procedures conducted in naturally occurring settings
- Natural experimental observations - events occur in nature, researchers, sometimes intervene, control conditions, to learn how things will turn out in real world context - natural events observed

²⁰ *W. parvovirus*, which is highly infectious, primarily produces mild illness (diarrhea) in calves. It is also present in young animals in which it produces more serious disease. Fergana reports that *W. parvovirus* is responsible for diarrhoea in lambs.
